

NCAA

The NCAA is the National Collegiate Athletic Association. It was established in 1906 and serves as the athletics governing body for more than 1,280 colleges, conferences, and organizations. The National Office is located in Indianapolis, Indian Member colleges, and Universities develop the rules and guidelines for athletics eligibility and competing for the three NCAA divisions. The NCAA is committed to the student athletes and governing competition in a fair, safe, and sportsman like manner. Division I and II may offer athletic scholarships, while Division III Universities may not. Students may obtain scholarships for academic merit in Division III schools as well as Division I and II.

All students must register with the NCAA Clearinghouse. **Please check on that tab for the address.**

NCAA CLEARINGHOUSE

The clearing house evaluates your academic record to determine if a student is eligible to participate in athletics as a freshman student athlete. The clearinghouse is an organization that performs academic evaluations for the NCAA. Students who want to participate in college sports during their first year of enrollment in college must register with the clearinghouse.

The clearinghouse staff follows the NCAA bylaws and regulations when analyzing and processing a student's high school academic records, ACT or SAT scores as well as information about amateurism participation to determine the student's initial eligibility.

Clearinghouse Registration

To register with the clearinghouse, you must complete and sign the Student Release Form(SRF) and send it to the clearinghouse with the registration fee. This will authorize your high school to send the clearinghouse your transcript, test scores, proof of graduation, and any other academic information. It will also authorize the clearinghouse to send your academic information to colleges that request your eligibility status.

The clearinghouse prefers students register on line. Go to www.ncaaclearinghouse.net Select Prospective Student Athletes and click on Domestic Student Release Form. Complete the SRF form on line. Please make sure to include your credit card information to pay the fee. Than follow the instructions to complete the transaction.

Print a copy of your completed registration form, and Copy 1 and 2 of the transcript release form. Sign the forms, and give them to your guidance counselor.
